## Certificates and Degrees Available & 7 Attractions of Department of Care and Welfare

We aim to have all of our students take and pass the Care Worker National Examination.

Upon graduation, students are eligible to take the Care Worker National Examination/  
Qualification for appointment as a social welfare administrator/Associate Degree.

National Examination Preparation Courses are offered from the first year –

Thorough and detailed guidance is provided in cooperation with other subjects to achieve a 100% pass rate.

Training approximately 2,200 caregivers over 30 years –

First to establish a "Department of Caregiver Welfare" among universities and junior colleges in Japan.

The number of full-time faculty members is one of the highest in the country for caregiver training schools –  
Tutoring system by full-time faculty members and high level of education.

Careful guidance system for practical training – "Practical training departure ceremony," "Individualized rounds of guidance for each student," and "Close cooperation with facilities and practical training supervisors".

Support for acquisition of various qualifications in addition to care worker— Care Therapist, Welfare and Housing Environment Coordinator Lev.2<sup>nd</sup>,3<sup>rd</sup>. Associate Dementia Care Specialist, Nursing Oral Care Promotor

100% employment rate every year –

Full employment support through on-campus employment counseling sessions, workplace seminars by alumni, etc.

Support for College Admission-

After obtaining a caregiver license, there is also a path to transfer to a four-year university to obtain a social worker license.
